Some of the skills involved in historical analysis include the following: evaluating the reliability, validity, and accuracy of historical sources

Document Based Assessment for Global History

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The document-based question is sometimes better understood as an evidence -based question: you will be given a question on an historical topic, and then provided with a series of documents, charts, maps, photographs, paintings, and other sources as evidence you will use to formulate your answer. Because the document-based question (DBQ) is a skills-based essay rather than a content-based question, it has a lot of moving parts.
